## A Reflection from James Hogan Mardi Gras and Ash Wednesday

Mardi Gras is French for "Fat Tuesday," the day before Ash Wednesday. It is also called "Shrove Tuesday" around the world, and "Pancake Tuesday" in Ireland. It is the last day of the pre-Lenten festival season called "Shrovetide." The time of carnival can last from Epiphany to the day before Ash Wednesday, as in the New Orleans' festival, or can run for a three-day period before Ash Wednesday.

In the medieval Church, Shrovetide was a time, not for partying, but for the confession of sins. "Shrove" meant "absolved." Abbot Aelfric wrote in AD 1000, "In the week immediately before Lent everyone shall go to his confessor and confess his deeds and the confessor shall so shrive him as he then may hear by his deeds what he is to do [in the way of penance]." Thus, forgiveness was given pre-Lent; penance was done during Lent.

In America, the Mardi Gras tradition became synonymous with New Orleans since the city's founding in 1723. Gradually, it was embraced by non-Catholic residents as well. Parades featured flame-carriers, music, dance, along with masks and costumes of fairies, beasts, and mythological characters. In recent times, revelry and drunkenness has obscured much of Mardi Gras' Catholic sensibilities.

Shrovetide has become a time to enjoy all the foods we are planning on giving up during Lent – pancakes, paczki, gumbo, sausage, sauerkraut, cakes, candy, cookies, pies, or alcohol. (This year I am planning on giving up for Lent all my New Year's resolutions.)

The name "Ash Wednesday" was formally introduced by Pope Urban II in 1099 for the first day of Lent, but the custom of placing ashes on the body goes back to biblical times.

In the Old Testament, when Tamar was sexually assaulted, she "sprinkled ashes on her head" (2 Sam 13:19) to signify her anguish. Jeremiah called for the people to "put on sackcloth" and "roll in ashes" (Jer 6:26) as sign of their repentance. Job atoned in dust and ashes (Job 42:3-6).

Ashes placed on the forehead by the priest in the shape of a cross is called a sacramental. A sacramental is not a ritual with one-third less calories than a regular sacrament; rather, it refers to a Church-approved ritual involving things that prepare us to receive grace, like holy water, palms, Stations of the Cross, and wearing miraculous medals or crucifixes.

Pope Gregory the Great (540-604) is credited with the traditional words spoken while distributing ashes made from the palms offered in the previous year, "Remember, man, you are dust and unto dust you shall return."

The Medieval poem, "Day of Wrath" (Dies Irae), was used for centuries in the Catholic Requiem Mass, set to music by the likes of Mozart and Verdi. It included a verse on ashes:

Low I kneel, with heart's submission; See, like ashes, my contrition; Help me in my last condition.

In modern times, Lent is marked by personal sacrifices made in preparation for Christ's ultimate sacrifice on the cross. Not all sacrifices are equal. For example, a man once took his young son to a baseball game. While they were sitting there, he asked the boy what he was going to give up for Lent. The boy replied, "I don't know, Dad. What are you going to give up?" His father said, "I've decided to give up liquor." Later in the game, the beer man came by, and the man ordered a beer. His son objected, "Hey, I thought you were giving up liquor!" His Dad answered, "Hard liquor, son. I'm giving up hard liquor. This is just a beer." The boy replied, "Well, then, I'm giving up hard candy."

No matter what you add or subtract to your life during Lent, Ash Wednesday is the day where you can get your ash in Church, where you belong.

THE BATTLE LINES HAVE BEEN DRAWN. The war has been raging since man tasted the fruit from the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil. That one act of disobedience opened mankind's eyes to the idols of the world, while closing the door of our hearts to the Will of God.

The Kingdom versus the world. On this battleground, each of our destinies is hinged upon the day to day choices we make. As Catholics, it is clear as to which side we are to pledge our allegiance to. One must make a choice. There is no glory nor grace in cowardice. There is no box to check for indifference. In other words, there is no room for complacency. One must be all in – no excuses!

The term 'surrender' does not bode well in the light of battle. Surrender is commonly defined as: to cease resistance to an enemy or opponent and submit to their authority. Or, to give over to the power, control, or possession of another especially by force. But this battle is different, isn't it?

Christianity, and specifically, true discipleship holds us to different standards. In order to win this battle, we must surrender. We must relinquish our pride, our self reliance, and most importantly our will.

Not by force, but through trust.. Not to an enemy, but to a lover. It is only by giving up our power, our control and our possessions, that we will be truly free.

The next logical question is: To whom are we to surrender? Or shall we say 'Whom'? 'W' or 'w'? And therein lies the difference.

Once we allow ourselves to to trust Jesus with our whole heart, through His grace, we are able to joyfully surrender.

# The Surrender Novena

This Lent we will be offering the Surrender Novena to use as a way to deepen our relationship with Jesus. It is a beautiful prayer based on the private revelations of Father Dolindo Ruotolo, (Servant of God), who lived in Naples, Italy from his birth in 1882 until his death in 1970. Father Ruotolo was a humble priest who suffered much during his life. He was a friend of Padre Pio and served as his spiritual director for a time. Father Ruotolo was graced with a mystical relationship with Jesus, Whose words make up the meditations within this prayer. Jesus told Father Ruotolo that there is no novena more powerful than this. Each meditation ends with the repetition of the phrase, "O Jesus, I surrender myself to You. Take care of everything." As we say this, we are abandoning ourselves to Divine Providence. As Jesus offers His promise of love, will you open your heart to surrender? May your Lent be joyfully blessed!

#### THE INTERNATIONAL ORDER OF ALHAMBRA




