Office of Catechetical Services Collection: May 11-12, 2024

A Reflection from Fr Jay – *The Eclipse*

In Chapter 12 of the book of Revelation, we read a great sign of the Blessed Mother, “a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars. She was with child and wailed aloud in pain as she labored to give birth” (Rev 12:1-2). Revelation goes on to describe another “sign in the sky” when it says, “Then another sign appeared in the sky; it was a huge red dragon, with seven heads and ten horns, and on its heads were seven diadems” (Rev 12:3).

Interestingly enough, I am told that on the day of the eclipse, there was also a comet visible with binoculars that has been nicknamed “the devil’s comet” (its real name is P12/Pons-Brooks). This comet shows up close to earth every 71 years or so and will be closest to earth on April 21st of this year. It is nicknamed the “devil’s comet” because it has occasional outbursts that make it appear like it has two horns.

There has been a lot of speculation about this eclipse and the comet, tying them to Revelation 12:1-5. There were many who were calling this “the Jonah eclipse,” since the eclipse was to have “totality” over seven cities in the United States with the name “Ninevah” – two in totality and five very near totality. “Ninevah” is the name of the city that Jonah was sent to preach, too. In Jonah’s preaching, we are told, “Jonah began his journey through the city, and when he had gone only a single day’s walk announcing, ‘Forty days more and Nineveh shall be overthrown’ the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast and all of them, great and small, put on sackcloth” (Jonah 3:4-5).

Some people are speculating that these two phenomena could be “signs from God that we need to repent.” There is no doubt that the entire western world, once called “Christendom,” needs to repent. These nations have strayed very far from the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The question is, “do these signs in the sky constitute a warning from God?”

Maybe, maybe not. Certainly, when we look at the Bible, we see that God used “signs in the sky” to announce significant events relating to both salvation and punishment. At the birth of Jesus, God sent a star that guided the Magi to Israel. That star appeared a couple of years before the birth of the Lord. In Luke 21:11, it says, “There will be powerful earthquakes, famines, and plagues from place to place; and awesome sights and mighty signs will come from the sky” and in verse 25, Luke goes on to say that Jesus said, “There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on earth nations will be in dismay, perplexed by the roaring of the sea and the waves.” In the year 70 AD, when the Romans destroyed the city of Jerusalem, the Jewish historian Josephus wrote of “strange signs in the sky” for months before the city was destroyed. Many of the citizens of Jerusalem saw the movements in the heavens as a sign of their vindication that God was going to intervene to save the city. Christians, on the other hand, saw it as a sign of “God’s judgement” coming upon the city. At that point, all the Christians left Jerusalem. While nearly a million people were killed when the Romans destroyed Jerusalem in the year 70 AD, scarcely any Christians died. They knew it was going to happen and all left town.

Is the eclipse with the “devils comet” coming (we could also throw in the earthquake of the east coast last week into the mix) a sign from God? I cannot answer that in a definitive way since I am not a prophet, but I do find myself pondering all the “coincidences.” The eclipse occurred on the Feast of the Annunciation of the Lord, the day after Divine Mercy Sunday. In St. Faustina’s diary, she related that she was told that the “time of mercy” will precede “the time of judgement.” Jesus indicated to her that “the time of mercy” is drawing to a close. The revelations to St. Faustina are, of course, “private revelations” and as faithful Catholics, we are not bound to believe any “private revelations.” However, Faustina has been declared a saint, the Church has instituted a “Feast of Mercy,” and the events of the eclipse and the “devil’s comet” are occurring right after the Feast of Mercy.

I believe these issues are worth pondering. But as faithful Catholics, we do not want these events to rob us of our peace. Whether you see these “signs” as significant or not, the fact is Jesus Christ is on the throne. He promised to make all things work out right in the end for those who love Him (Romans 8:28), and He promised to be with us always (Matthew 28:20). Whether these “signs in the sky” have any significance to the timing of God’s judgement upon the world or not, all we need to do is cling to the Lord and live out our faith in a life of love and we will be fine. As the Divine Mercy picture of the Lord states, “Jesus I trust in You.” Let us all trust in the Lord and be at peace!



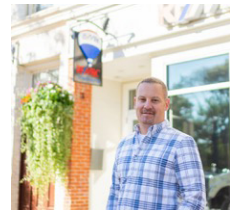

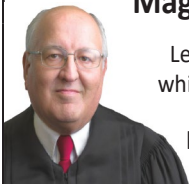
